The primary aim of this grant was to include undergraduate students in faculty research. I mentored

six undergraduate students – three (continuing students) who completed senior and honor's thesis projects with me, and three (new students) who learned about research in hopes of sparking an interest for future research. These students include first-generation, low-income, and ethnic minority students who are underrepresented in research and post-baccalaureate programs. Five of the six students presented some of this work at the Student Research Symposium (one was interviewing for a doctoral program) and all six students presented this work at a symposium at the Western Psychological Association's annual convention. This project will focus on hearing-related stress which occurs in response to the combined effects of hearing loss, listening environment, and communication demands. Using a combination of psychophysiological and self-report stress markers, we will compare hearing-related stress in individuals with and without hearing loss during conventional speech recognition tests. We will also identify acoustic factors that enhance sensitivity and we will develop novel protocols that involve both social context and demands that are closer to real-world communication. Two experiments were proposed. Study 1 will examine the effects of hearing loss and acoustic factors on hearing-related stress. Study 2 will examine the effects of social context, communication demand and hearing-aid use on hearing-related stress.
